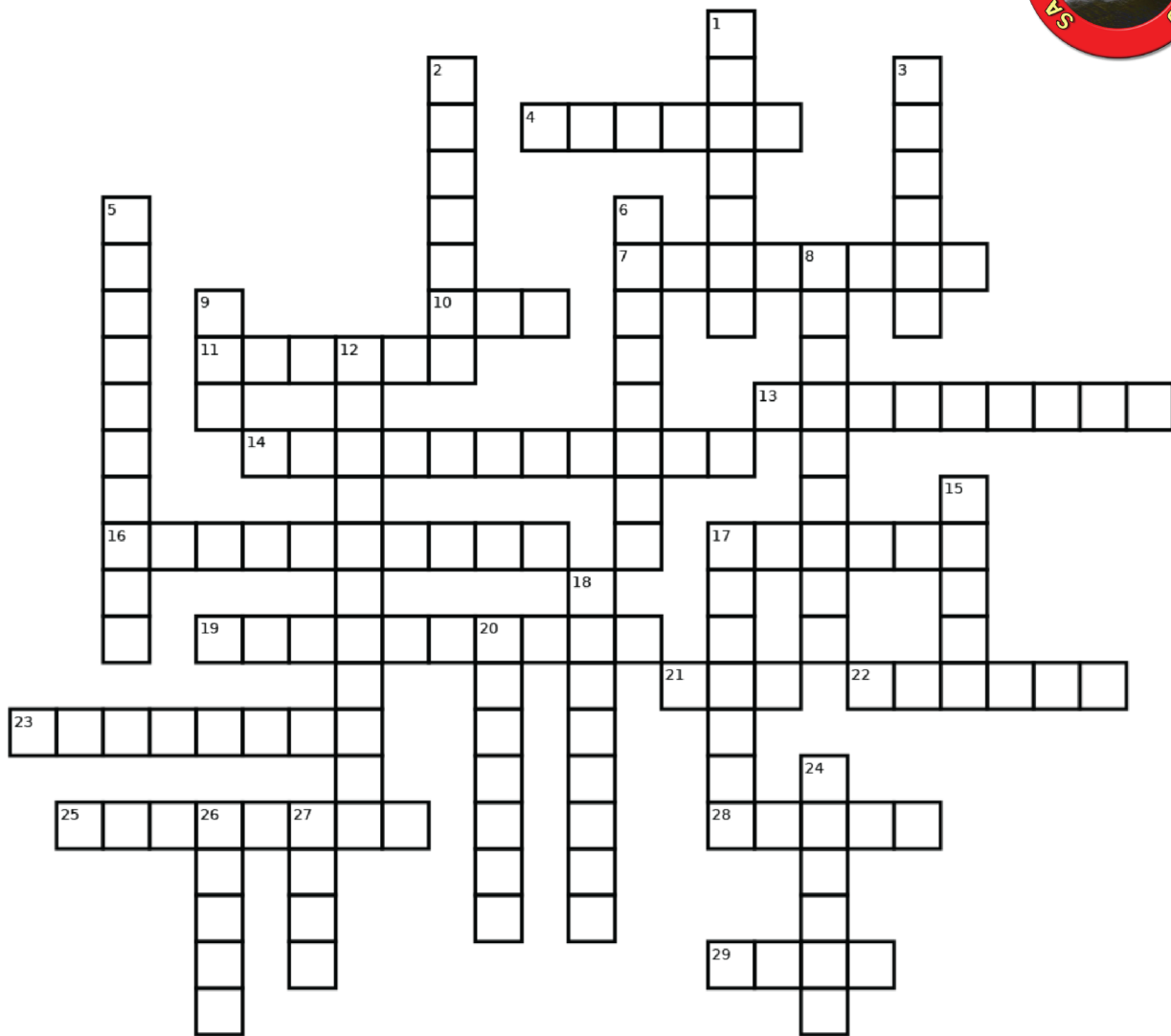

8. The name for all inland waters including the River Murray and excludes Lake Alexandrina, Lake Albert and any other waters subject to tidal influence.
9. A shallow area formed by sand, mud, gravel etc near the mouth of a river or at the approach to a harbour.
12. Occurs when substantial heat is lost from the body's core.
15. The unit of speed used on the water.
17. A liquid that can inhibits your ability to stay safe.
18. A type of grass that grows in the water.
20. A wide strait or waterway between two landmasses that lie close to each other.
